



66 CO2e Convert to no-till on a 100 acre farm







- » Reduce farm fuel when converting to no till
- » Offset farm electricity by adding renewable energy
- » Consider beyond-the-farm-gate impacts by reducing commercial fertilizer





#### Farmer Survey Attitudes


- 100% of farmers felt positive towards "soil health"
- 86% of farmers strongly agreed they have a responsibility to minimize erosion on their farms. O disagreed at all.
- When asked to rate how their neighbors felt about those words, one quarter felt their neighbors responded negatively to the phrase regenerative agriculture.

#### Farmer Survey Actions

- 64% reported using cover crops on some of their acres. 44% use cover crops on less than a quarter of their acres while only 8% use cover crops on more than three quarters of their acres.
- 46 farmers said that cover crops are important for soil health. Over those, 7 reported they do not use cover crops on any of the acres on their farm.
- 62% of farmers are doing some fall tillage

  - Rejection is scarier beforehand than after



#### Intro Farmer-Led Councils


Goal: Improve soil health on farms and reduce water pollution in rivers, lakes, and aquifers

# Is it Working? The Stats Across 4 Watersheds for 2022


- 3,575 acres of cover crops
- 2,588 acres of nutrient management
- 40.89 Acres of perennial establishment
- 4,296 Pounds of Nitrogen
- 3,543 Pounds of Phosphorous
- 4,000,000 pounds of sediment
